Well in Crockett County, Texas. Joe was aid climbing a dome pit when he fell forty feet and was killed. He was a companion of Becky Jones and lived near Austin, Texas.

Joe was cofounder, along with Linda Palit, of Gonzo Guano Gear. He was a member of the Univ. of Texas Grotto and the Bexar Grotto. He was a very experienced caver and NCRC instructor. In addition, he had caved throughout the southern United States and Mexico.
